Creating a 'civic heart' at Tottenham Green

Haringey Council has teamed up with architects Adams & Sutherland to produce designs for the regeneration of Tottenham Green. With a budget of £1.2m from the Mayor of London, we are working with the architects and local residents, businesses and landowners to create a 'civic heart' of Tottenham at the Green.

This project will deliver landscaping works, lighting, a revised network of paths, play space and new surfaces around Tottenham Green.

The proposed work on Tottenham Green is to act as a catalyst for change in the immediate area. Tottenham Green is surrounded by important institutions and faith groups including Holy Trinity Church, the College of Haringey, Enfield and North East London, the Bernie Grant Arts Centre, Tottenham Green Leisure Centre and Tottenham Old Town Hall – now a business centre. Thousands of people everyday are engaging in faith, learning, cultural and enterprising activities, but Tottenham Green remains an underused asset.

The proposed improvements to the Green, outlined overleaf, will create a much better focus to the area and will make the surrounding institutions more visible from the Green. As the 'civic heart' of Tottenham, the Green will become an area that supports and promotes performance, events, commerce and a café culture. It will tie together all the institutions, businesses and residents living and working around the Green and they will work with the Council to contribute to a sustainable legacy for the development.

Key proposals:

1. Tottenham Green leveled and minor works to mature trees to improve views including consideration of a reduction in numbers.
2. Gentle bank, with new planting, to the High Road where a widened pavement is defined by a low retaining wall, benches and extra space around bus stops.
3. Subject to negotiations with TFL, Town Hall Approach Road closed to through traffic with access only from the south. Road surface narrowed and raised and the park extended towards buildings along the Green. Uplighting to historic buildings.
4. Revised network of paths, centred on a new grove at the heart of the Green, with space for events such as markets and performances. This includes new direct access from the well in the north east corner to better link Church Green and Tottenham Green with new benches and lighting included through out the park.
5. Distinctive new hard surface for the Bernie Grant Arts Centre courtyard, reusing stone paving from the Green, to create space for outdoor events.
6. Special low level planted area including lawns, paving and a series of long benches in front of existing buildings.
7. Clad the electricity sub-station with mirrored panels to make it more attractive.
8. War Memorial, with setting significantly improved as part of the gyratory road works, has enclosure altered to offer a more fitting space for remembrance and improved access to the Green.
9. East Green 'refreshed' with improved furniture and surfaces including a new path to the north, a cherry tree grove and an informal natural play area, with low fencing.
