

THE TOTTENHAM CONFERENCE

The story so far

July 2014

- First Tottenham conference, launching the 20-year vision for Tottenham within the Strategic Regeneration Framework and Delivery Plan
- Launch of series of events for the Tottenham Summer Festival including musical performances and comedy workshops
- Community engagement with local residents at Northumberland Park commences

August 2014

- The Broadwaters £18million Inclusive Learning Community centre opens
- Timber-framed pavilion 'The Green Room' opens on Tottenham Green for community use

September 2014

- Tottenham UTC opens its doors specialising in Technology and Science for Sport, Health and Engineering. A joint collaboration between Spurs and Middlesex University
- West Green Road shop front improvements (phase 1) revealed
- Green Fair hosted on Tottenham Green
- Community engagement with local residents at Tottenham Hale around the new district centre commences
- Harris Academy Tottenham opens with year 7 students (based at Chobham Academy for one year)
- The Community Hub, at the Grange, 32-34A White Hart Lane, N17 8AD opens
- Crowland Primary School in south Tottenham rated 'Outstanding' by Ofsted – previous in special measures in 2012

October 2014

- Emeli Sandé opens music studios for teenagers on Eade Road, Tottenham
- Community First Fund supported by Haringey Council opens for submissions



November 2014

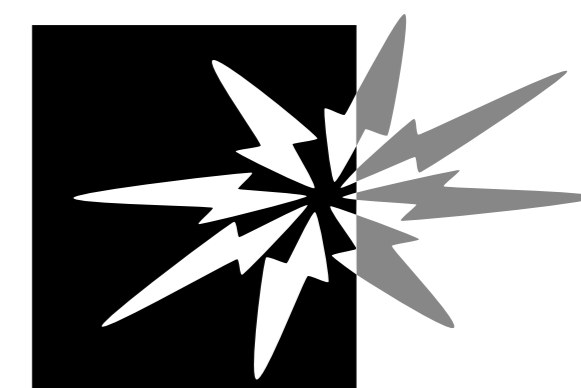
- N17 Design Studio opens. Groundbreaking partnership between Haringey Council, John McAslan + Partners and College of Haringey, Enfield and North east London
- Tottenham Hale Bus Station complete and station re-opened
- Tottenham Hale gyratory removal completed

December 2014

- Cabinet approval of High Road West masterplan proposing the regeneration of council owned Love Lane housing estate and land north of White Hart Lane including Peacock Industrial estate
- Deal signed with leading developer Grainger to transport Apex House site into new homes
- £1m for regeneration of Northumberland Park from DCLG Transformation Challenge Award
- Tottenham winter festival hosted on Tottenham Green
- Pupils from Lancasterian, St Paul's and All Hallows, and St Francis de Sales schools visit the House of Illustration

January 2015

- £8million redevelopment of Fusion's Tottenham Green Pools and Fitness, previously known as Tottenham Green Leisure Centre
- Police contact point opens at Northumberland Park Sainsbury's
- Isobel Place and Tottenham Town Hall win a London Design Award
- Shop fronts improvement programme, phase 2 commences
- Community Hub, 163 Park Lane opens
- Publication of Haringey Economic Development and Growth Strategy – A wide-ranging plan to drive economic growth in the borough by creating jobs in burgeoning industries and help thousands of people into work



THE TOTTENHAM CONFERENCE

The story so far

February 2015

- Tottenham Housing Zone bid successful – announced by GLA
- Tottenham Area Action Plan, consultation begins
- Tottenham Green, £1.5m landscaping project complete including children's playground at Tottenham Green East
- Love Lane residents visit £38m Brook House development, on the Old Cannon Rubber factory site
- Launch of Well London – Working with North Tottenham residents to improve health outcomes and wellbeing in the Northumberland Park and Love Lane communities
- Pocket Park – Houghton Road, construction begins

March 2015

- Second annual attendance to MIPIM 2015 – international property event
- NLA host an 'On Location' event at Tottenham attended by over 120 developers, architects, industry experts and representatives from the local community
- Launch of 'Haringey 100', a campaign for employers to take on 100 apprentices in 100 working days
- The Opportunity Investment Fund was launched, a £3.65m programme to enable investment in workspace and employment projects in Tottenham. The fund is jointly provided by Haringey Council and the GLA
- Victorian shop fronts in Tottenham High Road are to be restored to their original splendor after the council secured funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF). A grant of almost £1.5million from the Townscape Heritage Initiative Programme will be invested in reinstating the original High Road facades in the North Tottenham Conservation Area

May 2015

- 29 Love Lane residents move to new homes in Newlon Housing Trust: Ambrose and Mallory Court development in North Tottenham, formally the old Cannon Rubber factory site
- West Green Road Tropical Pocket Park officially opens. Part of the Mayor of London's pocket park programme aimed at greening urban spaces. It was part funded by the Greater London Authority and Haringey Council
- Tottenham Regeneration Team moves to 639 Enterprise Centre, Tottenham High Road
- More than 400 pupils from nine primary schools have taken part in a wide range of sports as part the Sports Inspired Games at Tottenham Green Pools and Fitness
- Northumberland Park Residents Association is formed
- London Overground (TfL) take over the West Anglia line through Tottenham with station updates and new trains planned



June 2015

- Second annual attendance to investor event: London Real Estate Forum, Mayfair
- A commitment to urgently increase GP provision in the east of Haringey announced by NHS England following calls from Haringey Council, working closely with Haringey Clinical Commissioning Group
- West Green Road bridge art unveils and celebrates one of Haringey's oldest schools; the Blanche Nevile School for Deaf Children
- Careers fair at Tottenham Hotspur Football Club co-hosted between Haringey Council and the Department for Work and Pensions
- Albert Place, an alleyway off the High Road unveiled looking cleaner, brighter and safer after a council makeover at the request of residents and traders
- Chicken Town Kickstarter funding secured after public campaign
- Over 180 local residents attend Tottenham Hale information days. Activities included: an exhibition of new housing plans and streets and spaces improvements, the Tottenham Hale model, walking and cycle tours around the area, and free exercise classes.

July 2015

- Second Tottenham Conference celebrating all things Tottenham hosted at Tottenham Town Hall
- Tottenham Green Market returns every Saturday until September and monthly from October
- Tottenham Hotspur unveils revised plans for 61,000 seated stadium including an agreement with the NFL to play a minimum of two games per year during a 10-year partnership
- The Selfie with an Indie campaign, organised by traders groups across the borough and supported by Haringey Council, aims to encourage even more people to realise and celebrate independent businesses
- Friends of Downhills Park's 14th annual arts event
- 22 students from St Francis de Sales and St Pauls & All Hallows Church of England Schools graduate from the 'Tottenham University' programme
- Construction begins on TfL's Cycle Superhighway from White Hart Lane stadium to Liverpool Street
- SALB – Stellar House, Altair Close, The Lindales, Bennetts Close and Cooperage Close Residents Association formed
