

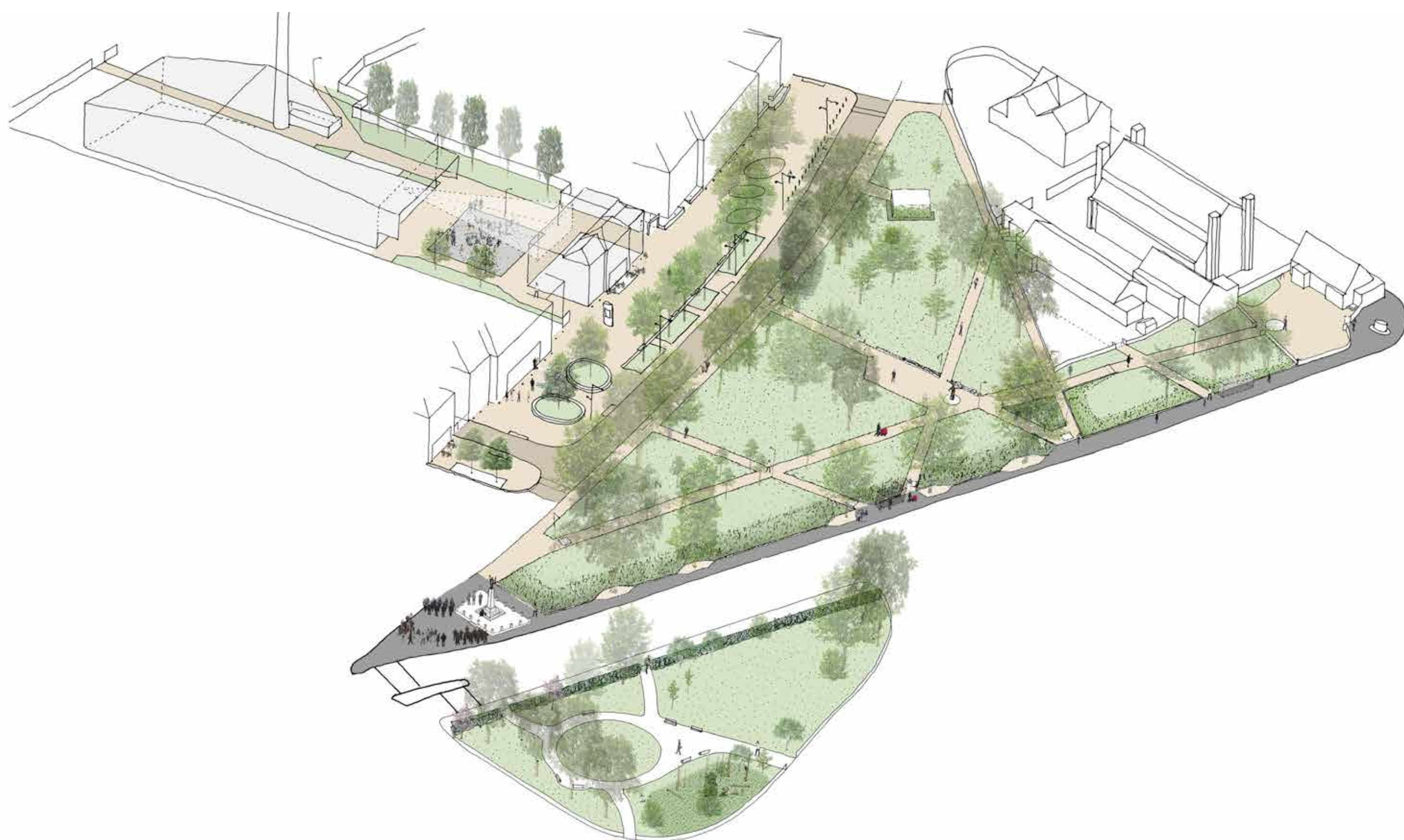
Introduction

Why Tottenham Green?

Tottenham Green and Town Hall Approach Road underwent significant improvements to its open spaces in 2014 leading to a revitalised Tottenham Green, and is now home to the Tottenham Green Market, as well as other events held regularly on the Green.

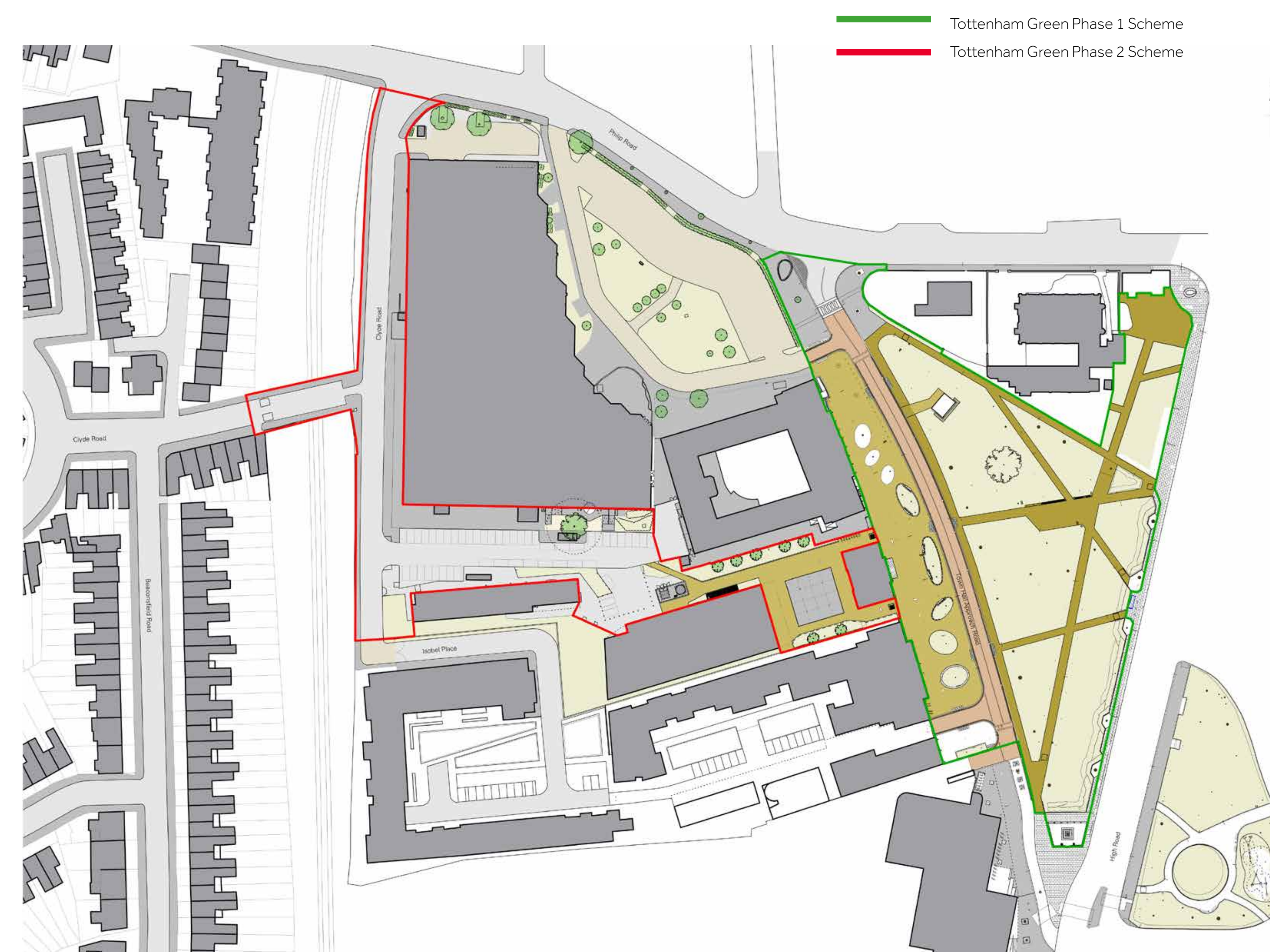
The scope of the improvements undertaken did not extend to those public spaces behind the civic buildings overlooking Tottenham Green on Town Hall Approach Road.

Those civic buildings include the Bernie Grant Art Centre, College of North East London, Ambitious College, Tottenham Green leisure Centre and Marcus Garvey Library.

The spaces and routes linking between these civic buildings is unwelcoming and require improvements to raise the quality of the public spaces to match those on Tottenham Green.

The council has been working with local stakeholders on proposals that aim to:

- Provide a safe, more attractive and greener environment for people to enjoy and use
- Raise the profile and visibility of the services on offer at Tottenham Green through integrated paths, feature signage and high quality surface materials



What has been done so far?

Following work to source funding for the improvement works, the council appointed Adams and Sutherland Architects as the design team for this project. These are the same architects responsible for the earlier of improvements on Tottenham Green.

Stakeholder engagement has included discussions with the council's library services at Marcus Garvey Library, Bernie Grant Art Centre, College of North East London, Ambitious College and Fusion Lifestyle who manage the Tottenham Green leisure centre.

We have also met with local community groups to capture their views on the current area, its uses, any current issues or concerns and opinions on how the space could be improved.

The views captured have informed the new design and we would now like to share the current designs with you. Let us know what you think!
